## SANA'A, REPUBLIC OF YEMEN 21-23 JUMADA AL AWWAL 1426H 28-30 JUNE 2005

The Permanent Finance Committee of the Organization of the Islamic Conference held its thirty-third session in Jeddah from 28 Rabiul-Awal to 3 Rabiul-Thani 1426H (07-11 May 2005) and examined the items on its Agenda related to the Administrative and Financial Affairs for submission to the 32nd Session of Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers (ICFM).

The deliberations of the Committee were presided by His Excellency Ambassador Ghaleb Saeed Al-Adoofi, Chairman of the Session.

- 1. Representatives of the Member States, the General Secretariat and the Subsidiary Organs took part in the meeting.
- 2. The Committee began with the examination of the items of the agenda submitted to it and agreed to submit the Draft Resolutions it adopted to the plenary Meeting for adoption. These are:
  - a. Resolution No. 1/32-AF on the Report of the 25<sup>th</sup> FCO and Report of the 33<sup>rd</sup> PFC.
  - b. Resolution No. 2/32-AF on the Report of the Extraordinary Session of the FCO to review the personnel situation and the accounts during the period 1<sup>st</sup> July to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2004.
  - c. Resolution No. 3/32-AF on the budgets of the General Secretariat and its subsidiary organs, for the Financial Year 2005/2006.
  - d. Resolution No. 4/32-AF on amendment to the Personnel Regulations of the OIC.
  - e. Resolution No. 5/32-AF on the study of alternatives available for reducing medical expenses for the General Secretariat.
  - f. Resolution No. 6/32-AF on the General Secretariat's report on Member States contributions and arrears.
  - g. Resolution No. 7/32-AF on the Report of the 5<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Intergovernmental Group of Experts in charge of the reform of the General Secretariat and the role assigned to it facing up to the challenges of the new Millennium

# RESOLUTION No. 1/32-AF ON THE REPORT OF THE 25TH FCO AND REPORT OF THE 33RD PFC.

The Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers in its thirty-second session (Session of Integration and Development), held in Sanaá, Republic of Yemen from 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> Jamad-ul-Awwal 1426H (28<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> June 2005),

Having considered the report of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Session of the Permanent Finance Committee (PFC), the report of the 25<sup>th</sup> session of the Finance Control Organ (FCO) concerning the closing accounts of the General Secretariat and its subsidiary organs for the financial year 2003/2004, and the replies of the General Secretariat and the subsidiary organs on the observations made in this respect,

#### Decides:

- 1. **To adopt** the report of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Session of the Permanent Finance Committee held in Jeddah from 28<sup>th</sup> Rabiul-Awwal to 03<sup>rd</sup> Rabiul-Thani (07-11 May2005).
- 2. <u>To request</u> the General Secretariat to undertake the necessary arrangements to ensure that the rent contracts concerning staff members in New York and Geneva offices are made in the name of the staff concerned in that capacity, on the one hand, and the name of the landlord or his legal representative, as the second party to the contract, on the basis of the title deed of the premises.
- 3. <u>To request that</u> appropriate measures be taken to remedy the financial irregularities registered in Geneva Office, namely the exceeding of the mobile telephone allocation.
- 4. <u>To increase</u> the ceiling of the Mobile telephone allocation for the Geneva Office to US Dollars 100 monthly.
- 5. <u>To take note</u> of the current status regarding the issue of the recovery of the General Secretariat's dues from Al-Ajhouri Company.
- 6. To take note of the arrangements made with the Lawyer's Office in Jeddah to follow up the matter until its settlement. The liquidation process and distribution of rights are underway as reported to the General Secretariat by the Lawyer's Office.
- 7. <u>To extend</u> thanks to Kuwait, Malaysia, Qatar and Turkey for their generous donation of US\$ 1 (one) million each to the benefit of the General Secretariat's budget.
- 8. <u>To call upon</u> the subsidiary organs to abide by the observations of the FCO contained in its 25<sup>th</sup> report, and to call upon the General Secretariat to collate

the observations of the FCO and the replies of the centres in accordance with the methods prepared by the General Secretariat, and to submit them subsequently to the PFC.

- 9. <u>To invite</u> the General Secretariat and the subsidiary organs to circulate documents of the PFC meeting on Member States at least one month before the meeting.
- 10. <u>Calls for</u> continued strict abidance by all OIC financial rules and regulations, particularly regarding the principles of transparency and production of documents in case of contracts, procurements and financial transactions.
- 11. Requests the Secretary General to follow the implementation of this resolution and to report thereon to the 33<sup>rd</sup> Session of the Islamic Conference of foreign Ministers

<u>Having considered</u> the recommendation of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Session of Permanent Finance Committee,

<u>Having examined</u> the report of ad-hoc Inter-governmental Working Group of Expert, <u>Having recalled that</u> the current Personnel Regulations of the OIC dated back to the 19<sup>th</sup> ICFM,

#### **Decides:**

- 1. <u>To approve</u> the proposed Personnel Regulations together with its annexes with effect from 01 July 2005.
- 2. <u>To apply</u> the amended Personnel Regulations together with its annexes to the Subsidiary Organs within the limits of the overall budget approved for each organ.
- 3. <u>To entrust</u> the Inter-Governmental Working Group of Experts (IGWGE) already set up by the 33<sup>rd</sup> PFC to review the Financial Regulations of the Organization and the Internal Rules and Procedures of the General Secretariat to be suggested by the latter and report thereon to the 34<sup>th</sup> PFC for further submission to the approval of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Session of the ICFM.

## RESOLUTION No. 5/32-AF ON THE

### STUDY OF ALTERNATIVES AVAILABLE FOR REDUCING MEDICAL EXPENSES FOR THE GENERAL SECRETARIAT

The Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers in its thirty-second session (Session of Integration and Development), held in Sanaá, Republic of Yemen from  $21^{st}$  to  $23^{rd}$  Jamad-ul-Awwal 1426H ( $28^{th} - 30^{th}$  June 2005),

<u>Having examined</u> the proposed study on alternatives available for reducing the medical expenses and taken note of the clarifications and explanations submitted by the General Secretariat, adopted a recommendation for the latter to:

- a- Adopt the health insurance scheme on an experimental basis for a period of two years with effect from 1<sup>st</sup> July 2005.
- b- <u>Assess</u> the advantages and disadvantages of the health insurance scheme and submit its report thereon to the 35<sup>th</sup> Session of the Permanent Finance Committee meeting.
- c- <u>Continue</u> applying the 10% deduction for any medical expenses excluded from the insurance coverage, in line with the existing rules.
- d- Adhere to the ceiling of the medical expenditure.

# RESOLUTION No. 6/32-AF ON THE GENERAL SECRETARIAT'S REPORT ON MEMBER STATES CONTRIBUTIONS AND ARREARS

The Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers in its thirty-second session (Session of Integration and Development), held in Sanaá, Republic of Yemen from 21<sup>st</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> Jamad-ul-Awwal 1426H (28<sup>th</sup> – 30<sup>th</sup> June 2005),

<u>Having examined</u> the report of the General Secretariat on Member States' contributions and arrears.

#### Decides:

- 1- <u>To apply</u> the following progressive measures to the Member States failing to settle their arrears before 1<sup>st</sup> July 2007:
  - Suspension of the right to apply for any vacant positions in the OIC.
  - Suspension of membership or requests for membership in all organs, bureaus and committees.
  - Exclusion from the possibility of hosting conferences and symposia or any OIC activity.
  - Suspension of the rights to speak at meetings.
  - Suspension of the right to vote.
  - Suspension or denial of assistance and facilities of the various OIC institutions as well as loans and projects under the IDB.
  - Suspension of membership in the OIC.
- 2- That these measures shall be applied in a progressive manner and lifted as soon as the concerned Member State settles its dues.
- 3- <u>To open</u> a special account at the IDB for the deposit of arrears to be made by the Member States so as to monitor the arrears that have been settled till 30 June 2007 and to submit a statement on this account in their report.
- 4- <u>To call on</u> the General Secretariat to observe the time frame as stipulated by Resolution No. 1/10-AF (IS) for implementing those measures.
- 5- <u>To suggest</u> that the Secretary General links up with the concerned Member States and avails himself of every possible opportunity for contacts with them including visits, if necessary, to urge them to settle promptly their arrears in order to avoid any possible embarrassment as a result of applying the aforesaid measures.

- 2. <u>Invites</u> the open-ended Inter-governmental Group of Experts (IGGE) to convene as soon as possible for a final consideration of the report and adoption of the relevant recommendations, and to submit its findings to the 33<sup>rd</sup> session of the Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers for approval.

The Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers in its thirty-second session (Session of Integration and Development), held in Sanaá, Republic of Yemen from  $21^{st}$  to  $23^{rd}$  Jamad-ul-Awwal 1426H ( $28^{th} - 30^{th}$  June 2005),

<u>Recalling</u> resolution No. 2/31-AF adopted by the 31<sup>st</sup> Session of the Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers,

<u>Having examined</u> the study prepared by SESRTCIC on the new scales of Member States mandatory contribution to the annual budgets of the OIC General Secretariat and its subsidiary organs,

Expressing thanks and appreciation for the objective and thorough study undertaken by SESRTCIC as well as for the latter's for it continued professionalism and dedicated work,

- 1. Requests the General Secretariat to re-circulate the SESRTCIC study to Member States in order to obtain their views.
- 2. <u>Defers</u> the matter to the 34<sup>th</sup> session of the PFC for consideration and further study and to submit a report thereon to the 33<sup>rd</sup> session of the ICFM.

# RESOLUTION No. 9/32-AF ON THE SHARE OF CONTRIBUTION OF THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF AFGHANISTAN TO THE BUDGET OF THE OIC GENERAL SECRETARIAT AND ITS

## SUBSIDIARY ORGANS

The Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers in its thirty-second session (Session of Integration and Development), held in Sanaá, Republic of Yemen from  $21^{st}$  to  $23^{rd}$  Jamad-ul-Awwal 1426H ( $28^{th} - 30^{th}$  June 2005),

Recalling the resolutions adopted by the Islamic Summit Conferences and Islamic Conferences of Foreign Ministers, specially those calling for the international assistance to rebuild Afghanistan;

Taking note of the UN resolutions on the situation in Afghanistan and its implications for international peace, security and stability;

Abiding by the provisions of Article 7 of the OIC Charter that stipulates that all expenses on the administration and activities of the Secretariat shall be borne by Member States according to their national income:

Taking into account the current grave situation in Afghanistan due to more than two decades of war;

Noting that about 80% of the Afghan economic and social infrastructure has been destroyed during two decades of war;

**Recognizing** the fact that contributing above 0.5 percent to the OIC budget is beyond the resources of the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan;

Recalling further the New Scale of Member States Percentage shares prepared by SESRTCIC, which establishes that Afghanistan is one of the least developed countries (LDCs) and according to all criteria, Afghanistan's contribution share ranges from 0.076 to 0.5.

Bearing in mind that the percentage share of Afghanistan to the UN budget is below 0.5;

Taking into consideration that Afghanistan's Gross National Income (GNI) is 0.239;

Bearing further in mind that currently some 19 Member States pay their contributions at the rate of 0.5 percent;

Noting also that the Government of the Islamic Republic of Afghanistan needs critical support in the process of stabilizing & reconstruction of the war-ravaged country;

Welcoming the establishment of OIC's Assistance Fund for the people of Afghanistan and the commencement of its operations;

Decides to reduce Afghanistan's rate of contribution to the OIC budget from 1% to the lowest rate applicable, i.e. 0.5% until the adoption of a new scale of contributions.
